

## Bachelor of Performing Arts/Bachelor of Laws (BPA/LLB) 2008

### Course code 2317

The law component requires that students complete 156 points of study, consisting of 12 compulsory units and a further 84 points of Law elective units.

The performing arts component requires that students complete 96 points of study, including eight compulsory units and eight elective units. Students may graduate with the Bachelor of Performing Arts degree after three years of study, provided they have completed a minimum of 144 points of study including the 96 points of performing arts units.
